



NIF – GDPR DATA PROTECTION AND COOKIE NOTICE

Last Updated: 17 June 2026

1. INTRODUCTION AND SCOPE

This data protection and cookie notice (this “**Notice**”) describes how NATO Innovation Fund GP SARL, NIF Investment Advisor UK Limited and NIF Investment Manager B.V. and each of their affiliates (“**us**”, “**we**”, or “**our**”) collect, use, disclose and otherwise process personal data of data subjects who are resident in the European Economic Area (“**EEA**”) or the United Kingdom (“**UK**”) (collectively the “**Data Subjects**”) who:

- visit or interact with our website (www.nif.fund) or other online platforms (collectively, the “**Websites**”);
- visit our premises or offices;
- communicate with us, including through e-mail, telephone, or post; and/or
- are a director, officer, employee, or contact at an Investor, Service Provider, or Business Partner (as such terms are defined in Part C of Schedule 1 (Definitions)).

If you are an Investor, Service Provider, Business Partner, or Governmental Authority, please provide this Notice to your directors, officers, employees, or contacts who have dealings with us.

We act as joint controllers of Data Subjects’ personal data under the EU General Data Protection Regulation, the UK General Data Protection Regulation, and related data protection laws in the EEA and the UK (collectively, the “**GDPR**”) in relation to the processing activities covered by this Notice. We have set out in section 10 (How to Contact Us) our respective responsibilities to deal with your data protection rights under the GDPR.

This Notice does not apply to data subjects who are applying for a role with us, or who are a current employee or staff member of ours. If we process personal data as a data processor, we will process such personal data in accordance with the terms of the contract we have with the third party for whom we act as data processor, and this Notice shall not apply to the processing of such personal data. The Website is not intended for use by data subjects who are not resident in the EEA or the UK.

Capitalised terms not defined in the main body of this Notice have been defined in Schedule 1 (Definitions). To receive this notice in another format (for example, audio, large print, braille) please contact us using the contact details in section 10 (How to Contact Us) below.

2. WHAT TYPES OF PERSONAL DATA DO WE PROCESS AND HOW DO WE COLLECT THIS PERSONAL DATA?

We may combine Personal Data that you provide to us with Personal Data that we collect from you, or about you from other sources, in some circumstances. This will include Personal Data collected in an online or offline context.

Special Category Personal Data

We do not request any special categories of personal data with respect to the data processing activities covered by this Notice (this includes details about race or ethnicity, religious or philosophical beliefs, sex life, sexual orientation, political opinions, trade union membership, information concerning health, and genetic and biometric data). However, Data Subjects may provide these types of personal data to us as Voluntarily Provided Personal Data. To the extent that we process such data, in addition to the GDPR lawful basis set out in Section 3, we will also satisfy an applicable GDPR condition under article 9(2)(a), article 9(2)(e), article 9(2)(f), or article 9(2)(g) GDPR for such processing.

Criminal Convictions and Offences Personal Data

We do not also request any personal data relating to criminal convictions and offences with respect to the data processing activities covered by this Notice. However, such personal data may be revealed to us because of KYC, AML, or transaction-related due diligence which we may conduct or be provided to us as Voluntarily Provided Personal Data. To the extent that we process such data, in addition to the GDPR lawful basis set out in Section 3, we will also satisfy an applicable GDPR condition under article 10 and/or EU member state or UK law, as applicable.

Personal Data relating to Children

Our Website and our services are not intended for children. We do not knowingly collect personal data from children under the age of 13. Parents or guardians of a child under the age of 13 who believe such child has disclosed personal to us, should contact us using the contact details at section 10 (How to Contact Us) below. A parent or guardian of a child under the age of 13 may review and request deletion of such child's personal data as well as prohibit the use thereof.

If a Data Subject has provided consent to processing and subsequently withdraws that consent, we may still process that Data Subject’s personal data where we have another lawful basis for doing so, provided that the Data Subject has not expressly asked us to stop processing their personal data in accordance with section 7 (Data Protection Rights).

Where we need to collect personal data by law or under the terms of a contract that we have with a Data Subject and the Data Subject fails to provide that personal data when requested, we may not be able to perform the contract we have with the Data Subject.

4. SHARING OF PERSONAL DATA

We may share Data Subjects' information with the following third parties (as defined in Part C of Schedule 1):

We require all our data processors and any other third party that we provide Data Subjects' personal data to respect the security of Data Subjects' personal data and to treat it in accordance with applicable law.

5. COOKIES

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer by websites that you visit. They are widely used in order to make websites work, or work more efficiently, as well as to provide information to the owners of the site. We use certain cookies on our Website and platforms. 6. INTERNATIONAL DATA TRANSFERS

Personal data may be transferred, stored, and accessed within the UK or EEA or transferred to, stored in, and accessed from countries outside the UK or EEA in order to fulfil the purposes described in this Notice, including Canada and the United States. For transfers to countries outside the UK and the EEA, the data protection regime may be different than in the country in which the Data Subject is located. Therefore, whenever we transfer personal data out of the UK and the EEA, we will ensure that we protect such personal data through having adequate safeguards in place (GDPR Article 46(2)), such as the EU 2021 Standard Contractual Clauses ("SCCs"), the UK International Data Transfer Agreement or the UK Addendum to the SCCs.

If the jurisdiction to which we transfer the personal data from the UK or the EEA is recognized by the UK or the European Commission (as applicable) as having adequate data protection regimes, we will rely on that adequacy decision (GDPR Article 45). You will be able to obtain additional details regarding our data transfer mechanism by contacting us as specified in the Contact Us section.

7. DATA PROTECTION RIGHTS

You may have the following rights under applicable data protection laws in relation to your personal data:

To exercise any of the rights set out above, please contact us using the contact details provided in section 10 (How to Contact Us) below. Where you have any such rights under applicable laws, we will respond to any such rights that you want to exercise within one (1) month of receiving the request, unless the request is complex, in which case it may take longer.

We may need to request specific information from you to help us confirm your identity and your right to access the personal data (or to exercise any of the other rights). This is a security measure to ensure that personal data is not disclosed to any person who has no right to receive it. We may also contact you to ask you for further information in relation to your request to speed up our response.

Please be aware that there are exceptions and exemptions that apply to some of the rights, which we will apply in accordance with the applicable data protection laws.

In addition to the above rights, you have the right to lodge a complaint at any time to any supervisory authority relating to Data Protection Laws in your jurisdiction in the EEA, or the UK. In the Netherlands, the relevant supervisory authority will be the Dutch Data Protection Authority (*Autoriteit Persoonsgegevens*, which can be contacted through its website: <https://www.autoriteitpersoonsgegevens.nl/een-tip-of-klacht-indienen-bij-de-ap>). In the UK, the relevant supervisory authority will be the Information Commissioner’s Office.

We would, however, appreciate the chance to deal with your concerns before you approach any supervisory authority and if you reach out using the details in the Contact Us section below in the first instance.

8. AUTOMATED PROCESSING AND DECISION MAKING

We may use automated software tools to produce transcripts of audio and video virtual meetings which may involve the processing of your personal data. These transcripts will be reviewed by a human being. We do not make any decisions regarding Data Subjects solely using automated decision making (including profiling) based on Data Subjects’ personal data where such decision produces legal effects concerning the Data Subject or similarly affects the Data Subjects.

9. RETENTION OF PERSONAL DATA

We will only retain Data Subjects’ personal data for as long as necessary to fulfil the purposes we collected it for, including for the purposes of satisfying any legal, accounting, or reporting requirements. To determine the appropriate retention period for personal data, we consider the amount, nature, and sensitivity of the personal data, regulatory requirements, the potential risk of harm from unauthorized use or disclosure of the personal data, the purposes for which we process the personal data and whether we can achieve those purposes through other means, and the applicable legal requirements. If we make any change to this Notice regarding use or disclosure of personal data, we will provide notice on the Website and as otherwise required. Small changes or changes that do not significantly affect Data Subjects’ privacy interests may be made at any time and without prior notice.
